



we rejoice that nothing in life or in death can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.





#### Cover Art

Today's cover art is *Ecce Homo*, by Georges Rouault, a devout Roman Catholic. An expressionist painter, he chose to make visual statements of inner emotion, and thus at times distort shapes and colors in order to project that emotion. In response to another of Rouault's works, *The Holy Face*, theologian Paul Tillich observed, "Here you have a face in which there is nothing sentimental. Here Jesus is completely adequate to the situation of extreme agony. He looks beyond the agony but is not beyond it: he is seriously and realistically in it. For this reason I think this head of Christ should be in many churches in our time, showing that the cross is not a sentimental nicety but is in Christ and in all of us in the terrible reality of existence."
