Whether you grew up Presbyterian or Baptist or Jewish or agnostic . . .


Whether you came with a friend or just wandered in accidentally . . .

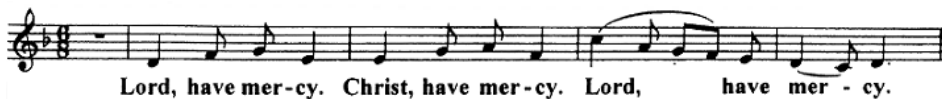





These fuschia-colored crocheted flowers are an example of “yarn bombing,” a form of street art or graffiti that uses yarn rather than chalk or paint. Yarn bombing brings color, warmth and whimsy to otherwise sterile or run-down structures and places—like the vacant lot and rusted fence in the photo. It is a pictorial representation of Paul’s words in Romans 5 that even suffering can produce hope.
