



The bread you are served is gluten free.


The bronzed chalices contain wine; you are invited to take a sip or dip your bread into the cup. The glass chalices contain juice; you are invited to dip your bread into the cup.

#### Cover Art

Did you know the Presbyterian Church (USA) has a mission statement? The first chapter of our *Book of Order* includes the Great Ends of the Church — the six main purposes of the church's life together: (1) the proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind; (2) the shelter, nurture, and spiritual fellowship of the children of God; (3) the maintenance of divine worship; (4) the preservation of the truth; (5) the promotion of social righteousness; and (6) the exhibition of the kingdom of heaven to the world. The cover art throughout this series includes visual representations of each. The first image, on the far left, includes an open Bible and a dove. The dove is a common symbol for the Holy Spirit and reminds us that scripture is the inspired Word of God. Each week in worship, we pray for the Spirit's guidance in understanding the scripture readings, that our lives might reflect the good news of the gospel message.
