A Letter from Rev. Beverly A. Bartlett

Dear Friends,

We pray that you and your families are safe and well. We enjoy seeing your faces and/or hearing your voices when you dial into the Zoom Gatherings, or participate in your committee meetings, or another online gathering, or simply speak by phone. As this time of staying home and physical distancing continues, we will be exploring more ways to be in touch and stay connected.

I want to let you know that Jenny, and her dogs Annie and Rose, have safely arrived at their new home in South Carolina. We pray for God's continued blessings on Jenny and her new ministry.

I am deeply grateful for all of you and the support you have offered in these past few weeks. The strength of our community, our commitment to ministry, our openness to the Spirit, and God's faithfulness will guide us through the coming months, as we support one another both through this pandemic and this time of pastoral transition. Remember—it is not just, or even primarily, the pastors of a church that define and carry out a church's ministry—it is the members. We weren't expecting this transition at this time, but I trust in God's vision for this church, and I trust in this congregation's commitment to serving God and one another in this place. As hard as our circumstances may be, I believe that we can mourn our losses AND grow from these times, discovering new ways of being the church and strengthening both our community and our outreach to our neighbors. As of last night, the Commission on Ministry of the Presbytery of New York City approved the Session's request that I be named Head of Staff for the next five months, which can be extended if need be, and they have appointed me Moderator of Session for this time. The Session will be working on next steps with the help of our liaison from the Presbytery, the Rev. Laura Jervis.

We do have some sad news to share with you. To date, we are aware of two deaths in the congregation due to the novel coronavirus: Clara Weber and Gordon Robbins. Both Clara and Gordon were living in long-term care facilities, which, as you know, have been hit particularly hard by this virus. We also learned of the death of former member Stella Clark Stewart. Many of our long-term members will remember Stella and her twin sister Grace Clark who were very active members for many years.

Though we have lost two of our older members to this virus, and others have been ill and are recovering, I am grateful that our congregation has not suffered more loss. The same cannot be said of other churches in our Presbytery. The Presbytery has lost many elders and one pastor.

Please continue to pray for:

one another, our church staff, those who are sick and those who have lost loved ones, those who have lost employment, our partners in the Synod of Harare in Zimbabwe who are struggling now more than ever, and our members and others who are health care workers or providing other essential services.

We plan to send out this Pastoral Staff Letter at the beginning of every week, so you will have an update on MAPC news and offerings.
