A Letter from Rev. Beverly A. Bartlett

Dear Friends,

Beginning this week we are changing our Gathering Together Zoom meeting schedule. We will have a Gathering Together at 7:15 on Wednesday evenings, and Fellowship Hour on Sundays at noon. In addition, there are other fellowship gatherings we encourage you to participate in, for example, High Tea at 4 pm this coming Thursday, April 30th, and the monthly Book Group, which meets next on May 12th. There are also more targeted groups like Moms' Night Out, a Young Adult Cinco de Mayo Gathering, Women's Bible Teleconference Call, and the Monday Evening Bible Study. You will find details about these below.

The Session met last night, April 28, and approved celebrating the Lord's Supper monthly during our online worship services and on other occasions as determined by the pastoral staff. We will be celebrating communion this coming Sunday, so please have some bread and juice or wine (or even water) as you worship at home.

Other Session business included:

- --Approved the dispersal of annual grants to our local partners who are doing a tremendous amount during this crisis.
- --Approved a grant to the Synod of Harare to help congregations drill bore holes. Lack of water is a critical concern.

--Approved a motion to work with the Commission on Ministry of the Presbytery of New York City to move forward in selecting an interim/transitional pastor. COM will recommend well-qualified candidates for Session to review and interview. Calling a transitional pastor is the responsibility of the Session. The process differs from calling an installed pastor which involves a Pastor Nominating Committee elected by the congregation and a vote to the congregation to extend a call. By working closely with COM, Session hopes to move quickly so that we can have a transitional pastor in place sometime in September.

We plan to send the Pastoral Staff Letter weekly on Wednesdays, and that will have the times for upcoming online gatherings and events.

You are in our prayers as we continue to navigate life in this pandemic time. We ask you for your prayers for each other, the church staff and officers, those who are sick or struggling financially, our sisters and brothers in the Synod of Harare in Zimbabwe and all who are providing essential services. We also ask that you pray for our congregation in this time of transition--that we will be open to the guidance of the Spirit in our discernment and strong in our sense of community and commitment to ministry and mission.
