A Letter from Rev. Beverly A. Bartlett

Dear Friends,

As our COVID-19 numbers in New York are beginning to move in the right direction, we pray that you and your family members are safe and healthy. Please know that the church is here for you--we can't address every need, but we will do our best to respond to emails and phone calls and help as we can.

We are heartened that so many people, members and non-members, including many who are at a distance, are finding meaning in our weekly Sunday worship services and daily devotions. One of the things we are learning is that even when we are able to resume worshiping in person, we will need to maintain an online presence to reach people who cannot be here in person. Some of those who live far away have expressed their gratitude through both words and financial contributions. We are deeply grateful for both. Our idea of church is being transformed, and "normal" will be different in the future. It is too early to know just what re-opening the church will look like, but we have heard enough to know that it will happen in stages, and we will all need to be flexible and open to change.

Between 25 and 30 people participated in our Zoom fellowship hour last Sunday. It was wonderful to see people and hear their voices. If we continue to get such a strong turnout, we may break out into smaller Zoom "rooms" part of the time, to allow for more conversation. Afterall, when we have fellowship hour in person, we are in small groups having conversation, not

one big circle!

Last Thursday's "High Tea" was a big hit, and we have planned another one. This past week we also hosted a Pre-Teen Zoom gathering for 3rd thru 5th graders, which, I understand, was great fun and full of energy! I'll be offering an hour of Lectio Divina tomorrow afternoon. Please read the announcements below for details on these and other Zoom gatherings. I think we have more opportunities to gather than ever!

Last week at the High Tea gathering, Lauren Logan shared a scone recipe that everyone wanted. Your wish is our command. Here you go!

Strawberry Scones

- 2 1/2 cups flour, plus more for dusting
- 2 tbsp sugar, plus more for sprinkling
- 4 tsp baking powder
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1/2 cup (1 stick) butter, cut up and cold
- 1/2 cup reduced-fat milk
- 2 large eggs, divided
- 1 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 cup chopped fresh strawberries

Steps:

Preheat oven to 375°F. Line a baking sheet with parchment. In a large bowl, combine the flour, sugar, baking powder, and salt.

Add the butter to flour mixture. Using a pastry cutter or hands, quickly work butter into flour mixture until butter is in pea-sized pieces but has not melted. To the bowl, add the milk, 1 egg, and vanilla, stirring and folding until just combined. Using a spatula, fold in the strawberries.

Transfer dough onto a lightly floured surface and gently knead just until dough comes together. Transfer dough to lined baking sheet and shape into a round loaf (approximately 1½ inches tall). Make 4 cuts into dough to form 8 wedges and separate, spacing 2 inches apart.

In a small bowl, whisk together remaining egg and 1 tbsp water. Brush the top of scones with egg wash and, if desired, sprinkle lightly with sugar. Bake 25–28 min., until golden brown on top and a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool on wire rack. Serve warm or at room temperature.
