#### A Letter from Rev. Beverly A. Bartlett

Dear Friends,

From my counting, we are in the midst of week 9 from when we started to cancel in-person activities, gatherings and events at church. This coming Sunday will be our tenth online, recorded worship service. The assistant principals at my daughter's high school hosted a "town hall" for parents last night, and while there were a few questions they could answer, they quickly moved to, "now, we can tell you what we don't know." It became very clear that for them, as for all of us, the next few weeks and months are full of question marks.

When will be able to open the church? We don't know.

When will we get back to in-person worship? We don't know.

When will we be able to have weddings and memorial services? We don't know.

God's people have lived with uncertainty for as long as there have been God's people--perhaps not always to this degree, but this time reminds us that we never really know what the future holds, and we trust God to guide us. Abraham didn't know what lay before him and Sarah, but he trusted God and followed. The people of Israel had no idea what they were in for when God led them out of Egypt and into the wilderness, but they followed (they grumbled, and rebelled at points, but they followed). When God's people

were taken into exile in Babylon, the future seemed bleak and unknown. The disciples didn't know what the future held when they dropped everything and followed Jesus. Jesus' followers didn't know just what lay ahead for them after he ascended into heaven and sent them into the world to carry on his work, but they carried his Word into the world anyway.

In the midst of uncertainty, here's what we DO know:

We continue to worship together.

We continue to join in fellowship through various Zoom gatherings.

We continue to care for one another through many, many check-in phone calls and in praying for one another.

We continue to get messages from our congregation asking, "what can we do?" "How can we help?"

We continue to study scripture together.

We continue to feed people who need a meal on Thursday evenings, and the Urban Outreach Center serves meals out of our doors on Tuesdays.

We continue to provide support to our local partners and to our sisters and brothers in the Synod of Harare during this crisis.

In other words, we continue to be the church. As the signs on our doors currently say, "Love is never cancelled."

This coming Sunday was supposed to be Youth Sunday at MAPC--and it still is! For the past couple of weeks April Martin, Mary Huff and Rebecca Heilman have worked with our children and youth to put together an online Youth Sunday service, which includes this year's confirmation class. Please tune in and then join us for Zoom Fellowship Hour at noon. We expect many of our young people to be joining us for that Zoom so you will have an opportunity to greet them.

We pray that you and those you love remain well.

# MAPC High Tea Recipes **Nut and Honey Bars**

From Marty Scotzin Make 16 servings

#### **Ingredients**

Oil or cooking spray for the pan

1/2 C. butter

1/3 C. honey

2/3 C. firmly packed brown sugar

1 egg

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

1 1/3 C. unbleached all purpose flour

1 teaspoon salt

1 cup chopped pecans or walnuts, divided

(I had pecans and almonds on hand, so I used them both.)

I also added in some dried cherries.

(You could add any dried fruits you like.)

#### Steps:

- 1. Heat oven to 350 degrees. Coat an 8-inch square baking pan with the oil or spray.
- 2. Microwave the butter and honey in a medium microwave-safe bowl on High for 45 seconds or until melted and smooth when stirred. Stir in brown sugar until smooth. Cool 5 minutes.
- 3. Stir in egg and vanilla until blended. Stir in flour, salt, and baking powder just until blended. Stir in 3/4 cup of nuts. Spread evenly in the prepared pan. Sprinkle with remaining 1/4 cup of nuts. Bake for 30 minutes, or until edges are golden brown and the center is set. Cool completely on a wire rack.
