A Letter from Rev. Beverly A. Bartlett

Dear Friends,

A somewhat briefer note this week from the porch in the mountains of North Georgia. It is an idyllic place to sit and write--looking out over the fields, pond and hills, listening to the birds. I hope you, too, find a place to restore your soul this summer--even if it is just sitting on a bench in Central Park. I am grateful to have this time with my family--and grateful to have this place where it is easy to keep physical distance in a state that is a hot spot.

As many of you know, since the murder of George Floyd, a group of anywhere from 16 to 25 MAPC members have been meeting by Zoom on Sunday mornings at 10 to engage in a Facing Racism study and discussion, using PCUSA materials. Last Sunday, the group decided to take a break until the Sunday after Labor Day and resume the Sunday morning discussions then. The goal is that educating ourselves about the history and current reality of racism, and learning how to be anti-racist will lead to change and action on an individual, church and societal level. So we aren't just taking a break in August, but continuing to read, and watch and listen to documentaries, podcasts and such. One of our members challenged us to also DO something this month, take some sort of action in our commitment to be anti-racist.

More Info: "Kate Bowler is a professor at Duke Divinity School with a modest Christian upbringing, but she specializes in the study of the prosperity gospel, a creed that sees fortune as a blessing from God and misfortune as a mark of God's disapproval. At 35, everything in her life seems to point toward "blessing". She is thriving in her job, married to her high school sweetheart, and loves life with her newborn son.

Then she is diagnosed with stage IV colon cancer.

The prospect of her own mortality forces Kate to realize that she has been tacitly subscribing to the prosperity gospel, living with the conviction that she can control the shape of her life with "a surge of determination". Even as this type of Christianity celebrates the American can-do spirit, it implies that if you "can't do" and succumb to illness or misfortune, you are a failure. Kate is very sick, and no amount of positive thinking will shrink her tumors. What does it mean to die, she wonders, in a society that insists everything happens for a reason? Kate is stripped of this certainty only to discover that without it, life is hard but beautiful in a way it never has been before.

Frank and funny, dark and wise, Kate Bowler pulls the reader deeply into her life in an account she populates affectionately with a colorful, often hilarious retinue of friends, megachurch preachers, relatives and doctors. *Everything Happens for a Reason* tells her story, offering up her irreverent hard-won observations on dying and the ways it has taught her to live."
