A Letter from Rev. Beverly A. Bartlett

Dear Friends,

As I write this late Wednesday afternoon, the meteorologists are warning that there is an "unsurvivable storm surge" about to hit the Louisiana and Texas coast as Hurricane Laura approaches, and that some coastal communities may be completely wiped out. What devastating news for all who are in its path. We may begin to know just how devastating the waters and winds from the storm are tomorrow, when it is safe for helicopters to begin to survey the damage, but it will probably be days before we know the real toll.

While there is a literal unsurvivable storm surge approaching the southern coast, it feels like we are experiencing metaphorical storm surges on many fronts--the horrifying police shooting of Jacob Blake, and equally terrifying shootings and killing of two protesters by an armed civilian; the struggle to make Black Lives Matter a reality in this country and not just a slogan; the wildfires in California; the ongoing ravaging of COVID-19, especially among communities of color, and our country's inability to do what other countries have done to control it--at least to the extent where outbreaks are manageable. In a Bible study and conversation this afternoon, (which you can watch a recording of here: https://www.pcusa.org/weekofaction/#3) that was part of the PCUSA "Week of Action", our Stated Clerk, the Rev. Dr. J. Herbert Nelson was speaking about the trouble we get into when we believe we are in control, when we cling to control. He spoke of this in terms of our country's response to COVID-19, "when others have been through the same pandemic

and it is now gone, and they've moved on with their lives, we're still hanging on to it because we can't slow down for a minute, and we can't, for some time, just be in the presence of God while the storm passes over."

In order to slow the virus, we have to stop for a while and let the storm pass over. In addressing other matters, like racism, we have to do the opposite and continually recommit ourselves to becoming anti-racist and work to change the structures and systems that keep racism embedded in our society. As the shooting of Jacob Blake reminds us, it is not time to "move on" and talk about something else. We have a long, long way to go before we can do that. Please make time to look at the PCUSA Week of Action web page (https://www.pcusa.org/weekofaction/). Watch something, engage in something, listen and learn from the voices of people of color you'll find in each day's offerings and activities.

I don't need to tell you what to include in your prayers--all you have to do is listen to the news. Here is a link to the hymn text that Rev. Nelson referred to in the Bible study, *The Storm is Passing Over*, by Charles Albert Tindley, whose father was a slave, and who became a Methodist minister and was both a captivating preacher and hymn writer.
