A Letter from Rev. Beverly A. Bartlett

Dear Friends,

As I write this, the Mayor and Chancellor have just announced that rather than in-person school starting for all public school students opting for the 'hybrid' model on Monday, there will now be a phased-in approach. I think most of us public school parents knew there would be further delays. "Uncertainty" is the word of the year (one of them, anyway), which means "flexibility" is, too--not just with schools, but with all areas of our lives: work, church, businesses, school, travel, holidays, and the upcoming elections. There is little that feels stable right now, and most of us are experiencing increased stress and anxiety, which means our faith and our church community are more important than ever. Even though MAPC has also had to be flexible, we are still the church, and Christ is still the rock upon which we build our lives. With the frustrations, stress and anxiety of our days overwhelm you, take a moment, close your eyes, breathe deeply, and remember that rock that upholds you. Remember that you are part of a community built on that rock. Pause, for just a moment or two if that is all you have, and anchor yourself again to that rock. Say to yourself the verse from Psalm 46, "Be still, and know that I am God."

Please be sure and join in the Zoom Fellowship Hour this Sunday. We will begin at noon as usual, and at 12:30 we will baptize Eleanor Gagnon Phalnikar. Eleanor's parents, Elizabeth and Rahul, and immediate family will be with me in the Sanctuary, and you all will be present through Zoom. As you know, we don't have private baptisms in the Presbyterian Church--the congregation is present and participates as we welcome those being baptized into the body of Christ, the church. We encourage you to be present on the Zoom gathering as we promise to support and love Eleanor as she grows in faith.


Though we are not yet ready to meet safely in-person in the Sanctuary, we are going to hold a Morning Prayer service on the Roof Garden, Sunday, September 27th at 9 am. You will need to make a reservation, and we have to limit attendance to 25 people, plus staff. The Central Park Conservancy will not issue permits for gatherings of more than 25-30 people, so meeting there would not allow for any more people to attend. You can find more details, including sign-up information, below.

Looking ahead a couple of weeks, we will receive Megan Rau and Stephen Eng into membership during the Zoom Fellowship at 12:30 on October 4. Once again, I will be in the Sanctuary with Megan and Stephen as we baptize Stephen, and we will include all of you via Zoom. Megan and Stephen were scheduled to join MAPC on Sunday, March 15, the first Sunday we went online. They have been active in our online ministries, have offered one of our daily devotions, and we are so glad they are officially joining us now, 6 months later!

Finally, today was the last day for our building staff employee, Jesse Wine, who is retiring. Many of you will have met of seen Jesse around the building, especially since he was often here on Sundays. Jesse has been at MAPC since 1999, longer than anyone else apart from 2 or 3 Day School teachers. Jesse has been dependable, kind, and unflappable--a steady presence even when asked to do things at the last minute and beyond the call of duty. We will miss him, and we wish Jesse a wonderful, long, healthy retirement. The staff met on the Roof Garden this afternoon to toast Jesse and say congratulations, thank you, and farewell.

We will offer an in-person Morning Prayer service on the Roof Garden at 9 am on Sunday, September 27. This will be a shorter service with prayers, scripture readings and music, probably no more than a half-hour. We have to limit the numbers to 25 people (plus staff), so reservations are required. Not only do we have to keep a count, but we have to have names and contact information for contract tracing. Masks covering both the nose and mouth must be worn at all times in the building and on the Roof Garden. We will take temperatures and have those attending sign a health attestation--which is the church's policy for everyone entering the building. 
Three Ways to Give to MAPC During this Time
