#### A Letter from Rev. Dr. J. Patrick Vaughn

Dear Friends,

As many of you are aware, the view of Central Park from the manse is spectacular. As Deb and I enjoyed the sunset one evening last week, I reflected on the events that brought you and me together.

It began with a surprise phone call from my Presbytery Executive several months ago. She asked, "Would you like to live in New York City?"

"Of course!" I replied. After a short pause, I said, "Uh. But where?"

"Manhattan."

"Manhattan? Absolutely!"

Another short pause.

"But which church? I am not aware of any vacancy in Manhattan."

"Madison Avenue."

"But they have a minister."

"Well, I don't know what happened but that person left, and they will soon search for a Transitional Pastor. May I submit your name?"

"Yes," I answered. "That would be fine."

My curiosity was piqued.

I had heard of the congregation but I really didn't know anything about it. After some research the situation seemed somewhat familiar: long term pastorate followed by a very brief tenure.

And this took place during the early days of the pandemic?

I have a passion for pastors and churches who have been hurt, wounded or deeply disappointed by the somewhat capricious nature of ministry. This is a very large group, and over the next few weeks I found myself thinking about you. Wondering how you were doing. Praying for you.

When the search committee later contracted me, we scheduled a couple of interviews. I was struck by how well they went. The elders were warm and caring, easy to talk to. They had a good sense of humor, and their love for MAPC was so apparent.

Throughout most of my ministry I have served as an installed pastor, and over the summer I pondered where I might serve next. I was open to both installed and transitional ministry positions, and, thankfully, a variety of opportunities presented themselves.

I wasn't sure where I would end up, and as Carolyn Clark, the chair of the search committee, can tell you the invitation to serve MAPC actually caught me a bit off guard.

I visited the church and had long conversations with Carolyn, Beverly, and Laura Jervis. That evening and over the next few days Deb and I discussed the possibility from a variety of angles.

We soon made our decision.

A year ago I could not have imagined serving MAPC, and you could not have imagined that another pastor would lead you.

But here we are. God has this curious habit of surprising us, startling us, and blessing us.

What might God have in store for us in the future? How will we grow and stretch and learn? How will we offer hope to a world bound by the fear and the uncertainty of a deadly pandemic?

These are just some of the challenges and opportunities that await us.

I love New York, and I am very thankful to join you at MAPC.


## **Peace and Global Witness Offering**

MAPC will receive the 2020 Peace and Global Witness Offering this Sunday, October 11. The Presbyterian Church USA collects this offering annually to equip the saints throughout the world to fulfill our mission of peace and reconciliation in the name of Jesus Christ. This year, 75% of MAPC's offering will go to this fund and 25% directly to the International Justice Mission, which intervenes to rescue and advocate for victims of human trafficking in the developing world.

## 2020 Stewardship Campaign



The Stewardship and Development Committee has worked diligently to plan this fall's stewardship campaign. Our Transitional Minister, Dr. Vaughn, will be at each gathering as will Rev. Bartlett. It is a challenging time to get to know a new pastor, and this is one of the ways we can do that. We hope to see you at one of the fall fellowship gatherings.

If you are unfamiliar with this type of service-it is not that different from a regular Sunday service, minus the sermon and communion! It is about a half-hour long, and includes prayers, hymns, scripture readings and some time for reflection. We can accommodate 25 to 30 people and request that you sign up ahead of time.

We need to keep track of numbers and information for contact tracing. Masks

covering both the nose and mouth must be worn at all times in the building and on the Roof Garden.

We will take temperatures and have those who attend sign a health attestationwhich is the church's policy for everyone entering the building. Please note that we are following (and exceeding) the recommended safety guidelines for participating in worship and singing hymns together.

#### A Walk in the Park


Please join MAPC friends and April for a masked walk in Central Park, Saturday morning, Oct. 17th.

Some of the questions Roy will address in this class include: Was Anne a proto-feminist? How did she impact the English Reformation? Why did she choose to die for her beliefs?
