A Letter from Rev. Dr. J. Patrick Vaughn

Dear Friends.

In my first two weeks with you, I have enjoyed getting to know you through Zoom calls, committee meetings, interactions with the staff, and walks in the park.

In no particular order, here are some of my initial impressions of Madison Avenue:

- MAPC is a remarkably and wonderfully diverse congregation.
- Members deeply appreciate the sense of community in the church, are concerned that this warmth and vibrancy seem to have faded over the past ten years, and want to nurture a stronger spirit of warmth, hospitality, and acceptance.
- Your elders as well as your trustees and deacons are deeply committed, and they devote untold hours to the ministry of MAPC.
- You appreciated Jenny's ministry and are still shocked, puzzled, hurt, and angry that she abruptly left during the pandemic.
- You are hungry to grow in faith, and you want to understand more deeply how our faith makes a difference in our lives and in our world.

- Mindful of a declining and aging membership, you have concern about the future vitality of MAPC.
- You have a very large endowment yet the high cost of maintaining the physical plant presents significant challenges.
- From the younger members to the older members you are weary of change, disruption and transition.
- You are thankful for your staff. They are a dedicated, creative, and talented team that has a passion for the ministry of MAPC. They are extremely motivated and committed.
- You value a rich history with a long tradition of strong preaching. You are rightly proud of this history but sometimes this appreciation of the past might keep you from more fully leaning into the future.
- You miss social gatherings at the manse.
- You want to reach younger families and believe these are necessary to sustain your ministry in the future.

After only ten days I do not know, of course, how accurately these actually reflect who you are. But I am encouraged. I am encouraged by your openness, your devotion, and your attitude. I am encouraged by how well you have continued to offer faithful ministry during the worst health crisis we have experienced in a century. And I am very encouraged by the way you have welcomed me into your community.

But what do you think? Do any of these impressions resonate with you? Surprise you?

I would appreciate hearing your thoughts and reflections.

For All the Saints

We remember the family and friends of two of our members who died in the past week: Martha Roby Stephens and Sally E. Cunningham.

Martha died at home October 17th, at the age of 96, after a lengthy illness. She joined MAPC in 2006, having found us through the Saint Andrew Music Society concert series and her love of music. Martha served as a deacon and was a constant presence at worship, fellowship hour and other events as long as her health allowed. A memorial service will be planned at a later date, when pandemic conditions allow.

Sally died October 16th and had re-joined MAPC in 2018. She had been a member in the 1980s, before moving to New Jersey. Both of her daughters,

Elizabeth and Katherine were baptized at MAPC and are currently members. Sally's granddaughter, Eleanor, was recently baptized in the sanctuary on September 27. Rev. Bartlett conducted a funeral for Sally with close family and friends present at the cemetery in Bridgehampton on Tuesday.

We will miss both Martha and Sally. We extend our condolences to all who loved them and pray for God's comfort and the sure and certain hope of the resurrection.

The deadline for the receipt of names is Wednesday, October 28.


Looking Forward to Advent

As long as the city and state health guidelines allow, we will continue to offer Morning Prayer services on Sunday mornings at 9 am. If you are unfamiliar with this type of service--it is not that different from a regular Sunday service, minus the sermon and communion! It is about a half-hour long, and includes prayers, hymns, scripture readings and some time for reflection. We can accommodate 25 people (plus staff) and request that you sign up ahead of time.

We need to keep track of numbers and information for contact tracing. Masks covering both the nose and mouth must be worn at all times.

We will take temperatures and have those who attend sign a health attestation-which is the church's policy for everyone entering the building. Please note that we are following (and exceeding) the recommended safety guidelines for participating in worship and singing hymns together.

Anne Askew was a remarkable young woman, martyred for her beliefs a few months prior to the death of Henry VIII. Some of the questions Roy will address in this class include: Was Anne a proto-feminist? How did she impact the English Reformation? Why
