A Letter from Rev. Beverly A. Bartlett

Dear Friends,

As I write this, I am enjoying my Christmas tree, listening to Christmas music, and looking out the window every few minutes as the snow falls. I can see the snow-bedecked church steeple, the neighbor's Christmas tree in the window across Madison Ave, and the beautifully lit Ralph Lauren store on the corner. A snowstorm is magical when you are warm, cozy, and have plenty to eat. I am grateful for these peaceful moments and the carols that remind me of the gift of Emmanuel, God-with-us.

I am also aware that my comfort and well-being is in sharp juxtaposition to what so many are experiencing who have run out of money to buy food, pay utility bills, put gas in their vehicle, pay for medications, and may be fearing eviction. I am very aware that our daily death toll from the corona virus now tops 3,000, and many hospitals throughout the country have reached capacity. I am kept awake at night with anxiety over what is happening in our country with millions of people convinced that an election that was remarkably secure and free of fraud was somehow "stolen" and

threatening people's lives over those conspiracy theories. I have no idea how to address the divide among us in this country that feels more and more like an uncrossable chasm. My Citizen app seems to be going off more frequently than ever with alerts of robberies and attacks, and on Sunday afternoon musician friends were caught up in the shooting at St. John the Divine that, thanks be to God, resulted in no deaths, apart from the deeply troubled shooter, but traumatized all who were there.

Yes, there is a disconnect between what I am enjoying in my warm, Christmas-y apartment watching this magical snow from the tenth floor and what is happening in the world around us. And yet, this season is a reminder to us that in the midst of darkness and human frailty, violence and cruelty there IS light and hope. Where do you find that hope? I encourage you to look for it, and to let it inspire you to live in such a way that your life embodies the hope, light and life of Christ. Here is one way you have brought life and hope: our friend, Abusa (Pastor) Pattison Chirongo is home after having his brain tumor removed. His recovery has been remarkable, and the gifts of many of you and of this church made his surgery and medical care possible. We continue to provide meals on Thursday evenings, and volunteers have already spent many hours sorting clothing donations for our future clothing closet. A team of deacons have regularly spent time with one of our older members in the hospital this week, either in person or by phone. The COVID-19 vaccine is starting to be administered. People are engaging in conversations about what it means to be the church in this time and going forward. Many who otherwise could not join us are worshipping with us online. There are signs and seeds of hope all around us--we just need to look for them, hold on to them, and nurture them, remembering as we prepare to celebrate Jesus' birth that "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not [and will never] overcome it." (John 1:15).

Please Note--Please note there will be no in-person Morning Prayer services on December 27 or January 3.

We will continue to offer Morning Prayer on Sundays as long as the public health guidelines allow for indoor gatherings of more than ten persons. Continuing any form of in-person worship also depends on worshippers following the church's guidelines below:

--Please use the Sign Up Genius link below to sign up. Since we must limit the number of people in the sanctuary, we need to know how many people plan to attend.

--Masks completely covering both the mouth and nose must be worn at all times.

- --Seating is marked, and worshipers may sit where the blue dots on the pews are located. If a couple or family occupies a blue dot, then the adjacent dot needs to be left vacant to allow for adequate physical distancing.
- --As hard as it is, refrain from greeting and speaking with one another inside the sanctuary. Hold your conversations for outside on the sidewalk after the service. Talking together outside is exponentially more safe than inside.
- --As much as we want to connect with one another, it is simply not safe for hugs, handshakes or other physical contact beyond the members of one's household. Please greet each other from a safe physical distance!

Pray for friends and neighbors and strangers. Or, simply sit and allow your mind to wonder from one memory to another.

We will observe social distancing, and no more than 25 will be allowed to gather at any one time. Blue dots mark the places where you may sit.

We hope this time in our sanctuary will prove to be a blessing as we prepare for the arrival of Christ.


Donations for Christmas Flowers

This is our annual reminder of the IRS rules concerning year-end contributions of cash and securities. In general, the delivery date determines the year in which a contribution can be claimed as a deduction. Checks mailed with a postmark of December 31, 2020 or earlier, or hand-delivered by December 31, 2020, will be credited as a contribution in 2020. Please note: The Church House and Business Office will close at 1 pm on December 31st! Please contact our Director of Administration & Finance, Roger Pierce or our Bookkeeper, Carmen Olmeda, by December 31st, if you wish to make a contribution or need assistance in making one. After January 1, 2021, contributions will be credited as contributions for 2021. For gifts of securities, the date of mailing is the delivery date; if hand-delivered, the date of receipt by the charity is the delivery date. When securities are delivered from a donor's bank or broker, the delivery date is the date the securities are transferred to the charity.
