A Letter from Rev. J. Patrick Vaughn

Dear Friends,

Are your heads spinning? Are you feeling irritated? Exhausted? Frustrated? Are you finding it difficult to sleep at night or concentrate on your work or enjoy a movie?

If so, you are not alone.

The images of the violence that erupted in the Capitol last week, emerging evidence that it was carefully planned, and the prospect of more violence in the coming days have deeply disturbed most of us. Our nerves are frayed, and our tempers are short.

Closely related to our political distress is the growing awareness in many of us of the profound horror and enduring legacy of racial injustice.

In this polarized environment conspiracy theories that would have easily been dismissed have proven resistant to rational discourse and critical thought.

And, lest we forget, we are still grappling with a lethal and politically charged pandemic that has isolated us and left us exceptionally impatient and annoyed with one another.

So, if you are feeling worn down, these are not signs of weakness. These are signs that you

Care about people

Grieve the loss of community and civility

Yearn for a different way of living together.

In other words, these are signs that you are human.

All of these intersecting and overlapping events have led me to ponder a series of questions. I am wondering how you would respond to these:

What is our unique calling at MAPC in this time and place?

How might we offer the gift of belonging to those in our city who are more alone now than ever before?

How do we comfort and reassure a hurting world even as we hold those in this world accountable for words and deeds that hurt and divide?

How might we share the hope and joy of knowing that all people are cherished by God?

We at MAPC have a strong and rich history of bearing witness to Jesus Christ. How do we stand on the shoulders of the saints who preceded us to offer words of grace and truth to our city today?

Let's find a time to chat. I would love to get to know you.

Morning Prayer In-Person This Sunday at 10:30 AM, Sanctuary



We will continue to offer Morning Prayer on Sundays as long as the public health guidelines allow for indoor gatherings of more than ten persons. Continuing any form in-person worship also depends on worshippers following the church's guidelines below.

--Please use the Sign-up Genius link below to sign up. Since we must limit

the number of people in the Sanctuary, we need to know how many people plan to attend.

--Masks completely covering both the mouth and nose must be worn at all times.

--Seating is marked, and worshipers may sit where the blue dots on the pews are located. If a couple or family occupies a blue dot, then the adjacent dot needs to be left vacant to allow for adequate physical distancing.

--As hard as it is, refrain from greeting and speaking with one another inside the Sanctuary. Hold your conversations for outside on the sidewalk after the service. Talking together outside is exponentially more safe than inside.

--As much as we want to connect with one another, it is simply not safe for hugs, handshakes or other physical contact beyond the members of one's household. Please greet each other from a safe physical distance!
