A Letter from Rev. J. Patrick Vaughn

Dear Friends,

Five hundred twenty five thousand six hundred minutes Five hundred twenty five thousand moments so dear Five hundred twenty five thousand six hundred minutes How do you measure? Measure a year?

On Thursday, March 12, 2020 Duke withdrew from the ACC basketball tournament. I was very disappointed. Some friends in Bedford, avid Duke fans, had invited me to their home to watch the game and join them for dinner. (Many months would pass before I would again have a meal with another person, even a member of my family.)

More importantly, on March 12 Tom Hanks and Rita Wilson announced that they had contracted Covid-19. Even though two days earlier New York state officials had drawn a containment area in a one mile radius around New Rochelle, their diagnosis somehow made the disease more real, more personal.

A year ago our world changed.

But how do you measure, measure a year?

The past year has been brutal, and, according to a March 8, 2021 article in *The Atlantic*, it has probably taken a greater toll on our emotional well being than we yet understand.

But for good news about the growing availability of the vaccine, for more hours of sunlight in the day, and for cups of coffee that point to a return of spending time together, I am thankful.

We will continue to offer Morning Prayer on Sundays as long as the public health guidelines allow for indoor gatherings of more than ten persons. Continuing any form of in-person worship also depends on worshippers following the church's guidelines below:

- --Please use the Sign Up Genius link below to sign up. Since we must limit the number of people in the sanctuary, we need to know how many people plan to attend.
- --Masks completely covering both the mouth and nose must be worn at all times.
- --Seating is marked, and worshipers may sit where the blue dots on the pews are located. If a couple or family occupies a blue dot, then the adjacent dot needs to be left vacant to allow for adequate physical distancing.
- --Please refrain from conversation with one another inside the sanctuary, and wait to greet one another after the service on the sidewalk. Talking together

outside is exponentially more safe than inside.

--As much as we want to connect with one another, it is simply not safe for hugs, handshakes or other physical contact beyond the members of one's household. Please greet each other from a safe physical distance!

MAUNDY THURSDAY, April 1






Cold Weather Accessories Drive


