# A Letter from Rev. J. Patrick Vaughn

Dear Friends,

In one of her many books, the exceptional Christian author, Anne Lamott, writes that help is the "first great prayer."

Does that resonate with you? If so, how? In what situations have you found yourself asking for help?

In this week's sermon we will explore an often overlooked dimension of prayer. Help is certainly an important form of prayer, but is it as foundational as Lamott suggests? What might undergird even our requests for assistance, for relief, for support?

To prepare for our exploration of prayer on Sunday, you might want to consider the following:

How comfortable are you praying in public?

What do you find challenging about praying in private? When I am praying, for example, I might lift up those in my life who are hurting or grieving. I might ask for the gift of discernment, but, then, I suddenly realize that I am debating whether to cook chicken or spaghetti for dinner!

I sometimes find it difficult to maintain focus when praying. Is that ever true for you?

What else might be problematic?

Do you ever stutter and stammer because you are not quite convinced that anyone is actually listening?

Prayer is a gift from God but what do we do when we feel separated from the giver?

I'll see you Sunday.



# MAUNDY THURSDAY, April 1







### **Curious About Jesus?**

What did Jesus actually say? What did he actually do? Many of us are curious about Jesus but we tend to avoid Bible studies because we do not want to expose our lack of knowledge about scripture. Beginning with Mark we will read one-third of a gospel each week. Then, on Sunday morning via Zoom at 9:00 we will gather together to share one or two passages that grabbed our attention. This is not a traditional class with a lecture. Instead, we will learn together as Patrick leads us in a conversation about the texts and questions that intrigue us.
