### **A Letter from Rev. J. Patrick Vaughn**

Dear Friends,

On Tuesday evening our Session met via Zoom. Here are several developments that I think you will find interesting.

First, the Personnel Committee announced that it had selected Chesna Hinkley as our next pastoral resident. This year's applicants were outstanding, and we are thrilled that she has accepted our invitation to serve at MAPC! Please congratulate Chesna when you see her!

Secondly, two members of our Presbytery's Commission on Ministry joined us. They apologized for the confusion surrounding our need to complete a Mission Study Review and explained that they do, indeed, want us to conduct one. Given that five years have passed since the last one, Rev. McDevitt's short tenure, and the unfolding impact of the pandemic on our ministry, they strongly believe that it is in our best interest to reflect anew on who we are and where God might be calling us.

They also noted that this process should not take a year and could be accomplished in as little as four months. Session, subsequently, agreed to ask the Congregational Nominating Committee to convene

and identify seven individuals who would serve well on the Mission Review Team. Those names will, then, be presented at a duly called congregational meeting for approval.

Are you interested in serving? Can you recommend someone who has the following gifts?

1. An ability to listen deeply, carefully and compassionately.
2. An openness to discovering new insights into the life of our congregation.
3. A desire and ability to work collaboratively as a member of a team.

Please give these questions your prayerful consideration. In an upcoming newsletter we will provide contact information for you to send your suggestions.

Thirdly, we created a Racial Justice Task Force. This group, which grew out of the Anti-Racism Discussion Group, will continue to offer educational opportunities that offer insight into the scourge of racism and its impact on our society. It will also explore how we might be able to engage racism as we strive to reflect Christ's love for all people.

I find the rise of white supremacy in our society deeply disturbing, and I am thankful that we at MAPC are willing to discuss and address it.

Fourthly, we established a second pastoral residency position that will focus on communication and community engagement.

One of the things that we have learned during the pandemic is that effective and healthy communication is not ancillary to a vital church. It is integral. We will seek a theologically trained and technologically skilled individual who will help us use various media more effectively, expand the use of video to tell the story of MAPC, and develop a comprehensive communication strategy that will help strengthen our congregation's relationship with other churches and ministries.

This second residency will be largely funded from resources that had been designated for our vacant Director of Communications position. Our request for Presbytery approval will go to the Commission on Ministry on April 6.

We will keep you posted!




