A Letter from Rev. J. Patrick Vaughn

Dear Friends,

The theologian, Jurgen Moltmann, has written that the cross is the test of everything that deserves to be called Christian.

As Christians we believe that it is in the cross that we are offered the most faithful glimpse of the kind of God we worship. Not a god of bloodline and land. Not a god of ancestry and family. Not a god of coercion and control. But the God who comes to us ever opening God's arms to embrace all people.

The depth of God's love was scandalous two thousand years ago, and it is no less scandalous today. It is scandalous because it subverts the powers of the world, undermines the priorities of the world, and replaces the hopes and dreams of the world.

What does the cross mean to you?

In one way or another we grapple with this question throughout the year, but it is especially pressing as we remember

Jesus' last meal with his disciples

his betrayal and arrest

his crucifixion

his burial in a tomb.

What does the cross mean to you? How does it shape your life? How does it inform how you live from day to day?

These questions are our focus for the next few days.

I hope to see you Easter morning.


