A Letter from Rev. J. Patrick Vaughn

Dear Friends,

When it comes to church life, numbers cannot fully convey the spirit, the love, and the impact of a congregation's ministry. Story, art, and discourse are much more effective and evocative.

Sometimes, however, numbers can make a statement about a church's vitality.

What, then, might numbers tell us about how well MAPC has engaged in ministry during the pandemic?

Over the past week the staff and I have engaged this question. I think you will find the following information both interesting and encouraging.

Over the past year the Day School has employed 25 teachers and nurtured 75 children.

20 members of the Church Choir and our Octet have met 22 times to safely rehearse and record hymns, service and choral music utilizing our Roof Garden and Sanctuary spaces for our pre-recorded worship services.

We pre-recorded six Saint Andrew Music Society concerts as well as our 16th Annual Carol Sing. To date we have had 3,762 combined views on YouTube and Facebook Live.

Since January, 15 people have regularly met on Sunday mornings to explore the gospels and the book of Acts.

For more than a year, between 6 and 24 individuals have met weekly to engage in the Anti-Racism study and discussion.

Between 8 and 15 in the Monday Evening Bible Study have continued gathering throughout the pandemic. They have focused on the Gospel of Mark, the Beatitudes, and 1 & 2 Samuel.

In the first few months of the pandemic Lectio Divina was offered twice a month on Thursday afternoons.

The Women's Bible Study continues their journey through the Psalms.

Afternoon Tea on alternate Thursdays was offered for the first few months of "staying home."

Wednesday Evening Lenten Series, "Praying with Scripture," regularly involved 6 to 10 people.

Except when the weather was unbearable, a group of 3-5 walked together through Central Park on Saturday mornings.

We held 2 Zoom Church Family Nights.

We offered 2 Saturday Crafturdays fellowship opportunities.

25 people attended our Halloween Gathering in Central Park.

Our Easter Festival in Central Park drew 50.

With 6 regular participants, the Mystery Book Group began meeting in February.

From the beginning of the pandemic through April 2021, Zoom Fellowship was held on Sundays at noon. Between 6 and 15 regularly participated. We held two Zoom Moms' Nights Out early in the pandemic.

In-Person Morning Prayer on Sundays started on the Roof Garden in September and moved to the Sanctuary in November.

Trick-or-treating on the steps attracted children, adults and a few dogs from around the neighborhood.

On Ash Wednesday we offered the imposition of ashes on the steps outside the Sanctuary.

40 Advent Boxes with devotions and activities were delivered or picked up in November & December.

65 Lenten Devotions and "You Are Loved" MAPC mugs were either delivered or picked up in February & March.

Fro the beginning of the pandemic Daily Prayer Devotions were recorded and emailed to the congregation. We began with 5 per week, and, then, reduced them to 3 per week when we began holding in-person prayer services. We wrapped up our video devotions last week with a series on the Lord's Prayer.

Youth served as leaders AND recorded parts of each of the Vacation Bible School lessons over 5 weeks last summer.

11 elementary age children are regularly participating in two midweek Zoom classes as an alternative to Sunday school.

6 eighth and ninth graders completed confirmation in May 2020. This year we have had 4 active participants. Each week 6 MAPC members (adults) join as mentors to the confirmands on Zoom.

Between September and November 2020 Youth on the Roof attracted between 6 and 12 high school students every week.

Between 4 and 10 middle and high school students join together weekly for fellowship, games, and Bible study.

3-8 young adults (plus 2 staff members) have met bi-weekly on Zoom on Monday evenings.

In 2020 MAPC received \$630,972 in offerings and tithes. Despite the loss of \$53,000 from several families who decided to withdraw from active participation at MAPC, \$620,134 was pledged for 2021.

Our NYCCC held over 200 in-person rehearsals on the Roof Garden, Parish Hall, and Sanctuary as well as more than 250 online rehearsals.

The NYCCC participated in 10 virtual guest appearances including the TODAY Show and three Appreciation Performances for the NYC Department of Health Frontline Team.

The NYCCC offered 2 outdoor concerts for the James Lenox House and Open Table Dinner. 5 in-person concerts were held for families.

The NYCCC will hear over 200 in-person and online auditions in May and June.

The NYCCC was a semi-finalist in the American Prize Competition for Excellence in Choral Performance and the Ernst Bacon Prize for American Music.

The NYCCC is preparing for 6 in-person Spring Concerts and a virtual Spring Concert.

The NYCCC is preparing a tour for vaccinated choristers to Pennsylvania in August.

We have expanded our in-person worship from a

30-minute Morning Prayer service to a 45-minute Service of the Word. The service includes a sermon in addition to the prayers, scripture and music that have been part of our Morning Prayer services for the past seven months.

We continue to follow the same stringent safety guidelines: masks completely covering the nose and mouth are required, physically-distanced seating will be observed, and we will refrain from greetings and conversation until we are out in the fresh air on the sidewalk after the service.




John Weaver Memorial Service

"How has this past year changed us?"


"What are our fears as we move into the next several months?"
