A Letter from Rev. Beverly A. Bartlett

Dear Friends,

In the winter of 2020, before the pandemic hit the US, our Sunday morning Adult Education class began addressing the issue of racism. We started by reading and discussing Martin Luther King, Jr.'s *Letter from Birmingham Jail* on the Sunday of MLK weekend, then began working through the Presbyterian Church (USA) *Facing Racism* curriculum in February. The turnout we had for those discussions was higher than what we had been getting for most Adult Ed classes for many months. That told us people wanted to engage this issue.

We put the *Facing Racism* discussions on hold when we had to stop meeting in person for the pandemic. When George Floyd was murdered over Memorial Day Weekend and the Black Lives Matter protests grew around the country, we realized we could not put it on hold any longer and began again in June, meeting by Zoom. That summer and into the early fall we would at times have more than 20 people participating in those discussions, and we had dozens attend the lecture and discussion we hosted this past February with Bishop Joseph W. Tolton, Founder and President of Interconnected Justice. We have continued the readings and discussions, moving from the Sunday morning Adult Education time slot to meeting at 5 pm on Sunday afternoons. Ten to twelve people have remained active in these weekly anti-racism discussions. It has been a powerful, transformative journey as we wrestled with challenging books and articles that have opened our eyes to the history of the concept of race, the development and ongoing pervasiveness of racism and white supremacy, the complicity of the white church, and the way racism continues to be embedded in our society—its economic, political and educational structures—and our psyches.

Earlier this spring the Session voted to establish a Racial Justice Task Force. That task force has yet to be formally organized, but in the meantime the Anti-racism Discussion Group encourages each member of the church to read at least one book or article this summer from this past year's reading list (see link below).

A couple of our members shared what this group has meant to them: "*My participation in this group has heightened my awareness of the depth of the racial divisiveness in our country and how our unwillingness to acknowledge and teach our actual history keeps us from being able to move beyond these divisions.*"
