A Letter from Rev. J. Patrick Vaughn

Dear Friends,

As many of you might recall, our son, Nathan, is in graduate school at the University of Wyoming. On Wednesday Deb and I are flying to Laramie to visit him. We last saw Nathan in August. I am very eager to see him but I am somewhat apprehensive about traveling to and fro.

Vacations and reunions have an added level of stress this summer. So many of us have been separated from loved ones over the past fifteen months. We have missed weddings and funerals, birthdays and graduations, Thanksgiving and Christmas. We have Zoomed here and Zoomed there, adopted pets, struggled with isolation, and lived with a gnawing sense of fear and foreboding.

While painful it is not really surprising, then, that congregations have begun reporting increased conflict. Staffs are worn down and suffering from exhaustion. Members are confused about when and how "regular worship" will resume. Some people are ready. Others are much more cautious. According to a recent Barna poll, 29% of clergy have given "real, serious consideration to quitting being in full-time ministry within the last year."

Churches, of course, are not the only ones experiencing delayed manifestations of stress and tension. The airlines have been particularly hard hit. For example, Forbes reports that in 2019 and 2020 the number of "unruly" airline passenger incidents were well under 200. As of May 2021 such incidents have already reached 394.

What's going on? I imagine that there are many factors, but surely none is more significant than fatigue. We are a tired people. Tired of isolation. Tired of lacking control. Tired of health protocols. We are physically, emotionally and spiritually tired.

As I prepare to leave the city for several weeks, I offer you one hope. I hope you will be kind.

Be kind to yourself.

Be kind to your family.

Be kind to the person seated bedside you.

Be kind to your friends.

Be kind to the waitress.

Be kind to your neighbor.

As the prophet Micah (6:8) writes,

He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

Kindness is our calling, and kindness is our gift to the world, a world that yearns for a word of hope.




