A Letter from Rev. Beverly A. Bartlett

Dear Friends,

I had a wonderful two weeks on the coast of Maine, and with this week's heat wave in NYC, I confess, I wish I was still there!

During July and August we will have a monthly Pastoral Staff Letter rather than weekly. We hope today's newsletter will have all the information you need until the beginning of August! Of course, we will still send out reminders as needed.

For the past three Tuesday mornings, most of the pastoral staff and four elders have been participating in an online seminar, taught by Christen Kinard of Digital Congregations, on How to be a Hybrid Church--a church with both in-person and online ministry. It has sparked a lot of ideas, challenged our traditional thinking, and made us all think about what our ministry will look like going forward. One of the things we, and most churches, realized when we were forced to take most of our ministry online is that there really is no such thing as simply "going back to normal." Normal has changed. If we weren't a "hybrid" church before the pandemic, we will need to be one going forward. The question is how do we do that well? How do we serve

both our in-person congregation and our online community--whether in worship, Christian Education, spiritual formation, and even fellowship.

One of the blessings for us of this past year, is that many of our programs have actually grown--children's ministries, youth gatherings, adult education classes--we have had more people, of all ages, participating in Christian Education than in the past several prepandemic years. Committees met by Zoom, and many of them have had better regular attendance. Gathering online allows people to join from wherever they are--do you go to a second home most weekends or for much of the summer? You can still participate in MAPC ministries and worship with us from wherever you are. Are you having trouble finding childcare for an evening meeting? You can join that meeting from home. Are you having trouble making Sunday mornings work for you or your family for worship? You can worship anytime with a recorded service. Are you feeling under the weather? You can join worship or Bible Study from home.

As we learned and discussed in the class, being a hybrid church doesn't just mean recording or live-streaming your church's worship service. It means learning how to best serve people who are at the church in person AND those participating online.

Some other things we learned:

- *Sunday morning in-person worship attendance can no longer be the "stick" by which we measure how active someone is, or how healthy a church is.
- *A hybrid church requires creativity and flexibility--and the willingness to experiment! Some things we try may not work, and that's okay. "Don't be an expert, be an explorer!"
- *Online worship is a *real place* where *real people* gather. It's different than in-person worship, but not less real.
- *Participating online is as valuable as participating in person.

Coming through the pandemic has been a unique journey--and we continue to be on that journey. We can view becoming a more welcoming, active hybrid church as an exciting expansion of our concept of ministry and being a church, or we can lament that things are changing and long for "the good old days." We can hold on to the best of who we are, AND move into a future that enables and equips

more people to participate in the life of the church in new ways.

I look forward to continuing this journey with you,
