# Saturday

Reiki Level I Workshop, This Saturday, November 4, 9 am to 4 pm, 5th Floor



The MAPC Deacons are sponsoring a Level I Reiki workshop for any who are interested on Saturday, November 4. Reiki is a spiritual, hands-on healing technique first developed in Japan. Reiki is a Japanese word meaning "universal life energy," and is helpful for relaxation, reducing stress and anxiety, easing pain, and promoting healing. Many hospitals use Reiki to complement medical treatment. Anyone can learn Reiki! It is not a reli-

gion and is practiced by people of all religions.

Our instructor for the workshop is Wendy Wade, who is a Reiki Master and long-time active member of St. James' Episcopal Church. Wendy has given brief Reiki introductions to the MAPC Board of Deacons on more than one occasion, which led to the interest in offering a more indepth Reiki Training Workshop.

The workshop will begin at 9 am and conclude at 4 pm, with an

hour for lunch. Wendy will give us a brief history and explanation of Reiki, teach us the basic technique, and lead us in practicing Reiki. There is no charge for this Level I training, but we do ask for a \$15 donation for coffee, snacks and lunch. ## **Adult Education**

This Sunday, Dr. Darrell Guder will present a lecture titled "How the Reformation Transformed the Western Church" during our 10:10 am Adult Education hour.

Darrell Guder is the Henry Winters Luce Professor emeritus of missional and ecumenical theology at Princeton Theological Seminary. Before coming to Princeton, he served as seminary faculty in the field of mission at Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary and Columbia Theological Seminary. He coordinated and edited the re-

search project published as Missional Church: A Vision for the Sending of the Church in North America in 1988. He has published Be My Witness: The Church's Mission, Message and Messengers (1985); The Incarnation and the Church's Witness (1999); The Continuing Conversation of the Church (2000); and most recently, Called to Witness: Doing Missional Theology (2015). He has published numerous essays and chapters focusing on primarily on the missional church conversation. He currently serves as the Director of the Center for Church Planting and

Revitalization at Princeton Theological Seminary, and he chairs the board of the Center for Barth Studies.


## Moms Night Out November 6, 7 pm
