## Adult Education, 10:10 am, Dana Chapel

This Sunday, Dr. James "Jim" Kay, Academic Dean of Princeton Theological Seminary will continue his discussion on Presbyterian Worship as he presents, "Sundays in New York: Whither Presbyterian Worship?"

Last Sunday, we focused on the 1991 Presbyterian *Book of Common Worship* Service for the Lord's Day; including, the development of set liturgies in American Presbyterianism, the impact of Vatican II on Presbyterian worship, and the resulting ecumenical convergence on the recurring features of Christian worship on the Lord's Day.

This week, we look forward to discovering how set liturgical texts can be celebrated flexibly to embrace "American expressions" from "puritan," "evangelical," and "frontier" traditions. We do not have to be stuck with the separation of "classic" versus "contemporary" worship that is dividing many congregations. Examples will be shared as "discussion starters".

Lenten Series Led by Dr. Eric Springsted Wednesdays Through March 21, 6:30-8:30 pm, Parish Hall "Living Life Sacramentally: Faith and the Importance of the Imagination"



We hear arguments for and against Christian faith. But arguments, at best, test our faith. At its real heart is the ability for us to imagine, to see the world as being God's creation, including seeing a sacrifice at its core. In these five sessions, we will look at what role the religious imagination plays in our living faith, especially in living life sacramentally, that is, as a way of partaking in God's own life by engaging God's presence in the world. This will also consider how important the arts—poetry, music, painting and sculpture are to religious faith. They are not just window dressing, but expressions of what can be seen in God's world.

## **Donations for Easter Flowers**




