

Adult Education: "Who is Jesus: Reflections on Jesus from a South African Perspective," 10:10 am, Dana Chapel



This Sunday, join Dr. Dirk Smit from Princeton Theological Seminary for a lecture on Jesus Christ set against the background of the Confession of Belhar, one of the newest confessions added to the constitutional documents of the PC(USA).

The Confession of Belhar has its roots in the struggle against apartheid in South Africa and is an outcry of faith. The Belhar Confession addresses three main issues: the unity of the church, reconciliation, and the justice of God.

Dr. Smit holds an MA (Philosophy, Stellenbosch), DTh (Stellenbosch), DPhil (h.c.) (Umeå, Sweden), and PhD (h.c.) (Protestant Theological University, Groningen). His appointments include Honorary Professor of the Humboldt University, Berlin (Germany), Extraordinary Professor of Stellenbosch University (South Africa), Fellow of the Institute for Advanced Study, Berlin (Wissenschaftskolleg zu Berlin), and Member of the Academy of Science of South Africa (ASSAf). Smit currently serves as a professor of theology at Princeton Theological Seminary in New Jersey.

Over the past three decades, Smit has emerged as one of South Africa's most significant theologians. He has written extensively, in both English and Afrikaans, on the legacy of the Reformed tradition and its relevance to contemporary theological, social, and political questions. He has been a particularly prominent and influential voice in the church's repudiation of apartheid.


Search and Care
