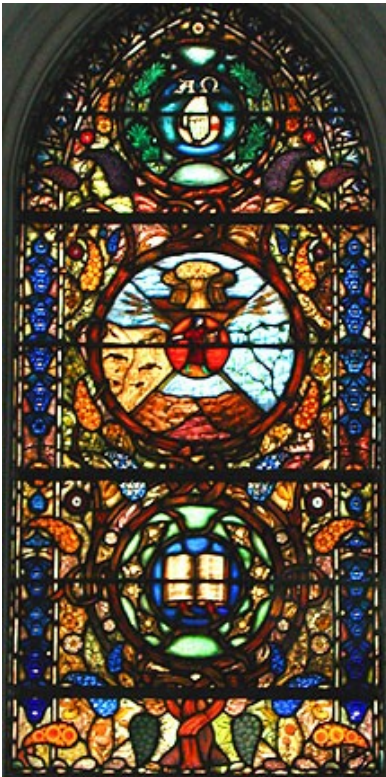
Search and Care
