


The Call of Wisdom (2012)





Today's cover art, *Tree of Life (Etz Chaim)*, was painted by Sheva Chaya Shaiman. She writes: "This painting was created during the second Lebanon war, as I was yearning to connect to life beyond the tumult of the moment. As a family, we [moved] from place to place, not knowing what would be the state of our lives from day to day. I needed a way to hold on and stay stable. Rebbe Nachman from Breslov speaks about seeing the good points. He says in the Torah *Azamra* that even if some-one witnesses someone doing something wrong in front of their eyes, instead of judging that person unfavorably, to stop that natural inclination and think, *this person must have done something good in their life*. Changing the focus of the thought literally changes reality. This painting mas my attempt to see the good in a moment that really didn't look good at all. One night this painting flew out, alive and full of joy and hope. Over time, this painting has become proof to me that when we make the effort to believe that there is something good through the darkness, it pulls through and surprises us. (shevachaya.com)
